The Principal's column

COMMON ENTRANCE TEST

Common Entrance Test (CET) for admission to Class VI and IX was conducted in the School on 18 Dec 23. A total of 2600 candidates appeared for the test of which 2343 candidates appeared for admission to Class VI while 257 candidates appeared for



Class IX. Besides the School, APS Kamaraj Road and APS ASC & C were also the CET test centres where 1611 and 1322 candidates appeared for the test, respectively.

ARMY DAY OBSERVED



Army Day was observed on 15 Jan 2023 with a slew of activities. These included English and Hindi Essay writing competitions and a Painting competition. Cadets of Cl VIII – XI participated in the activities which were

conducted at APS ASC Centre & College. It may be recalled that Army Day is celebrated on January 15 every year to commemorate General (later Field Marshal) K.M. Cariappa taking over the command of the Indian Army from General Sir FRR Bucher, the last British Commander-in-Chief in 1949 and also to honour the Defence Forces. The 75th Army Day was held in Bengaluru this year.
