# MAJ GEN ANOOP JAKHAR, ADG ASEC & ETRC VISITS SCHOOL

Maj Gen Anoop Jakhar, Additional Director General Army Standing Establishment Committee (ASEC) & Education and Training Review Committee (ETRC) visited the School on 12 Dec 23. He was leading an ASEC team that had come to the School for spot review of Peace Establishment (PE) revision. Brig Atul Bhadauriya, Brig ASEC and Col Samir Srivastava, Col ASEC – 3A were the other members of the team. The ASEC team was briefed by the Principal on various academic, administrative and manpower issues the





School faces. The General Officer had a brief interaction with the academic and non-academic staff over tea, during the course of which he impressed upon the academic staff the vital necessity of establishing a good rapport with the cadets to help them reach their full potential and fulfil the School's vision. Later the ASEC team went around the School campus, visiting the classrooms, the laboratories, the library, the dormitories, the MI room and sports fields to get a first-hand observation of the situation on the ground. It may be recalled that ASEC periodically reviews the manpower of units and formations and evaluates authorizations.

Talks were also delivered by a well-known motivational speaker. Patriotic songs and dances by students of APS and the NCC cadets enlivened the function. The cadets returned, inspired to work diligently

on their cherished dream. It may be recalled that Maj Akshay Girish is an illustrious alumnus of the School who was martyred on 29 Nov 2016 while leading a QRT to neutralize terrorists at Nagrota.

### PARENT-TEACHER MEET

The Pre-Winter vacation Parent Teacher Meet was held on 16 Dec 23. The parents were informed of their wards' academic performance by the Class teachers and were asked to encourage their wards to work diligently to improve scholastic areas that needed improvement. The Principal sought the parents' co-operation in the School's effort at helping the cadets excel academically while also shaping their overall personality. The parents' concerns were addressed to sympathetically. They were also informed of the new system being developed to keep



them updated on their wards' academic performance through the electronic medium and the School website and were requested to check on the cadets regularly and keep them motivated.

#### **COMMON ENTRANCE TEST 2023**

The Common Entrance Test 2023 for admission to Classes VI & IX was held on 17 Dec 23 at the School. A total of 1757 candidates (Cl VI: 1697, Cl IX: 60) appeared for the exams. The Board of Officers detailed for the purpose was headed by an officer of the rank Lt Col from the Parachute Regiment Training Centre, Bengaluru as the Presiding Officers and Officers and JCOs from the Corp of Military Police, the Parachute Regiment and the Madras Engineer Group as the members. RMS Bengaluru staff



played a crucial role in providing all possible support for the smooth conduct of the exam. The exam material was sealed and dispatched to the Dir AE-2, IHQ of MoD, New Delhi for further action. Besides RMS Bengaluru, the CET 23 was also held at 03 other exam centres, namely, APS K Kamaraj Road (2102 candidates), APS ASC C & C (1522 candidates) and 515 ABW School (500 candidates).

### MOTIVATIONAL TALK BY COL BS DUHAN

In continuation with the School's effort in instilling into them officer like qualities and to keep them motivated to join the Armed Forces as officers, a motivational talk by Col BS Duhan was conducted on 15 Dec 23. 
