SCHOOL RETURNS EXCELLENT CBSE BOARD EXAM RESULTS

A total of 68 cadets wrote the Class X AISSE 2023 wherein as many as 26 cadets secured more than 90% marks and 31 cadets scored between 80 – 90%. 
SCHOOL AWARDED HIGHEST GRADING OF AAAA+ BY CAREERS 360


