SCHOOL ANNUAL REPORT ON THE 73rd ANNUAL DAY CELEBRATIONS

1. Honourable Chief Guest Mr Brij Mohan Sharma, Chairman and Managing Director, India Health Insurance TPA, Chairman Express Clinics, Managing Partner, Naples Technology Ventures and an alumnus of RMS Bangalore, distinguished guests, revered Georgians, parents, members of the staff and cadets. On the auspicious occasion of the 73rd Annual Day Celebrations of this prestigious institution, it is my proud privilege to extend a very warm welcome to you all.

We are extremely grateful to Mr Brij Mohan Sharma, for his kind consent to preside over the function and give away the prizes.

It is a matter of great honour and pride for me to present the Annual Report 2019 this evening.

Education at RMS encompasses a wide range of academic and co-curricular activities, aiming at the holistic development of the cadets. This evening would like to put forward some of the achievements of the School.

2. At the very outset, it gives me immense pleasure and satisfaction to report that RMS Bengaluru, in keeping up with its traditions, has maintained its position in the list of the Best Indian schools. In the latest rankings released by the 'Education Today Magazine', RMS Bangalore is ranked 4th in India, 1st in Karnataka and 1st in Bengaluru under the 'India's top 5 Boys Boarding School' category. As per the survey conducted by 'Education World', RMS Bengaluru is ranked at 8th Position in All India Best Boys residential school Category, and No 2 in Karnataka

3. ACADEMICS:

Academics is accorded the highest priority in the school for which the staff and administration work diligently to give an enjoyable, productive and healthy learning experience for the cadets.

CLASS XII- Out of the 46 cadets, 08 have passed with distinction and 32 in first divisions.

CLASS X- Out of 47 Cadets. 09 have scored more than 90% marks, 24 have scored between 80- 90% marks Cdt Rajeev Kumar Rai, topped the class with 93.6%.

4. NDA

The school has always been aggressive towards the preparation of the cadets for NDA. It was a resolute effort by the cadets as well as the staff to see 25 cadets out of 46 clearing the UPSC written exam for NDA out of which 15 were recommended by the "Services Selection Board" (SSB) for 142 course of NDA. Two more cadets from the same batch and three from the previous batch have cleared their SSB for 143rd course of NDA.

I express my deep gratitude to ASC trg centre and school for providing special SSB coaching to RMS cadets

In recognition of this performance, RMS Bengaluru was awarded the "Chief of Army Staff Trophy".

This year 38 cadets of class XII have appeared for written exam for NDA and I am expecting a much better result from this batch.

5. CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES:

A wide range of inter-house activities were conducted during the

academic year. At the same time, cadets were provided with ample opportunities to participate in inter-school competitions as well. Some of the achievements worth mentioning are:

- (I) In the Interschool Bhatia Memorial Shield English Debate Competition organized by the Old Boy's Association, Rashtriya Military school has lifted the overall championship trophy by competing with 26 participants from 13 reputed schools across Bengaluru. Cadet Aditya Arya bagged the second position and Cdt Kishan Singh bagged the fifth position in the competition.
- (ii) In the Interschool Verbattle Debate Contest 2019, Cadet Tarang Bhardwaj and Cadet Aditya Arya secured runners up position at the state level by defeating 90 participants of different schools in the senior category.
- (iii) In the inter school competition held at Christ school, RMS Bengaluru won the overall runners up position and a cash prize of Rs 10,000/- by defeating 38 schools in various competitions
- (iv) Cdt Anmol Singh Chauhan & Cdt Rajat Gangwar bagged third prize at the State Level Philately Quiz Competition, conducted by India Post at Mangalore by defeating 80 teams from all over Karnataka.
- (v) In the District level English Debate conducted by Philately Club Bengaluru Cdt Anshal and Cdt Anurag Verma bagged 1st and 2nd position in the seniors category and Cdt Brihad and Cdt Anmol Chauhan bagged 2nd position in the juniors category.
- (vi) Cdt Raja Babu and Cdt Shubham Jha won first position in the Essay writing competition conducted by Tata Building India
- (vii) Cdt Hasin Zaman & Cdt Arun Kumar of class IX attended 10 days young Journalist programme conducted by Times of India from 01 April-10 April 2019.
- (viii) In the Lt Gen Inder Singh Gill Memorial English and Hindi debate, RMS teams have bagged the first position. The team was rewarded with a cash price of Rs 10000/-

6. In Mathematics and science olympiads organized by Karnataka Vigyana Parishad, Cdt Himanshu, Cdt Kumar Abhishek, Cdt Shubham Jha, Cdt Diwakar Suman of our school secured high rankings at the district level. Cdt Kumar Abhishek secured 1st rank at the State level and was awarded a cash prize of Rs 12,000.

7. GAMES AND SPORTS EVENTS

Games and Sports is an integral part of our curriculum. In addition to the regularly organized inter-house competitions, the cadets actively participated in various inter school tournaments and brought laurels to the school.

- (I) The School's team put up a spectacular performance in the Inter-Rashtriya Military Schools Pentangular meet held at Chail and lifted the Runners up Trophy.
- (ii) In the Inter School Hockey tournament conducted by SAI,

both the junior as well as seniors' school team won the Overall championship trophy. Cdt Sachin of Class IX was awarded the trophy of Best Player of the tournament.

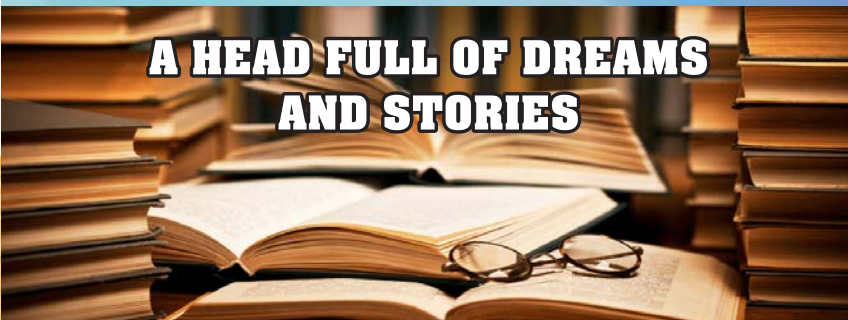

HIGH COURT

High Court is the head of judiciary in a state. There are 24 High Courts in India, three having jurisdiction over more than one state. Six High Courts – Allahabad, Bombay, Guwahati, Madhya Pradesh, Chennai and Rajasthan have 11 permanent benches amongst themselves. Only Karnataka has two circuit benches at Dharwad and Gulbarga. Among the Union Territories only Delhi has its own High court. Other union territories come under the jurisdiction of other states. Every judge of the high court is appointed by the President of India. A judge of the high court can hold the office until 62 years of age. A high court judge can demit his office by resignation in writing addressed to the President. He/she can be transferred to any other high court by the president.

05 AUGUST 2019

In the future, when we shall look on the most important dates of independent India's history, 05 August 2019 would be certainly highlighted. This is the date when the Article 370 and Article 35 A of the constitution of India were revoked and the state of Jammu & Kashmir was announced to be bifurcated into two Union territories- J&K with legislature and UT of Ladakh without legislature.

Let us look back, when India and Pakistan got independence in 1947, Jammu and Kashmir also got independence. After a few weeks of independence Pakistan ordered its force (majority of them were tribes) to attack J & K. The then ruler of Jammu and Kashmir found that he was not in a position to resist the attack from Pakistan forces. So the Maharaja of J & K Hari Singh approached India for help. The then governor General of India Lord Mountbatten asked him to first sign the Instrument of Accession. The Maharaja signed it and then India sent her troops to resist and counter attack the invaders. When Indian troops were pushing the Pakistani tribes back, the United Nation ordered both the nations to remain at their positions, but India had covered most of the part. The Prime Minister of India, Jawaharlal Nehru implemented Article 370 and Article 35A in the Indian constitution which gave Jammu and Kashmir a special status. He did so on the insistence of his dear friend Sheikh Abdullah, the royal ruler of the state.

Virtually the article divided the independent India into two parts. The J&K had its own parliament, supreme court and constitution, and even a separate flag. The head of the state was called Prime Minister, not Chief Minister. The natives of J&K had citizenship of two countries i.e India and J&K. The people of other states could not purchase land there. If a girl of J&K married a boy of other state of India, she would lose her citizenship of J&K. But, if the girl married a Pakistani boy, the boy was granted the citizenship of J&K. This obviously was against the spirit of our nation. Even if Indian government wanted to implement some policies there, approval of the state was required for the same. Because of this J&K could not develop much, the employment opportunities were very less and the youth, with the encouragement from Pakistan based groups, chose the way of terrorism. They fought against their own country and the situation deteriorated with time.

With the abrogation of the Article 370 and 35 A, the region has been fully integrated to the mainland India in all respects. People of other states can buy properties in J&K, girls can marry any boy they like without the fear of losing their rights in the state. Indian government can implement policies and decisions which can benefit the state. The supreme court of India will be the highest judicial authority for them also. They will follow the constitution of India fully, the tri colour will be their flag. Employment opportunities will increase as many industrial houses will try to establish their factories there. As a result, the youth will follow the right path and abandon inhuman activities like terrorism. This will bring progress, prosperity, peace and happiness in this beautiful part of India.

इस पूरे इलाके में ४० करोड़ से अधिक आबादी रहती है एक तो कोरोना महामारी का

सन १९१३ में वल्लभ भाई पटेल को भारतीय राष्ट्रीय कांग्रेस का अध्यक्ष चुना गया तथा १९४१ में अंतरिम सरकार में गृह मंत्रालय सूचना और प्रसारण मंत्रालय का कार्यभार सौंपा गया। भारत की एकता अखंडता के लिए उन्होंने अद्वितीय कार्य कर दिखाया। सरदार वल्लभभाई पटेल १५ दिसंबर १९५० को हमेशा के लिए चले गए।

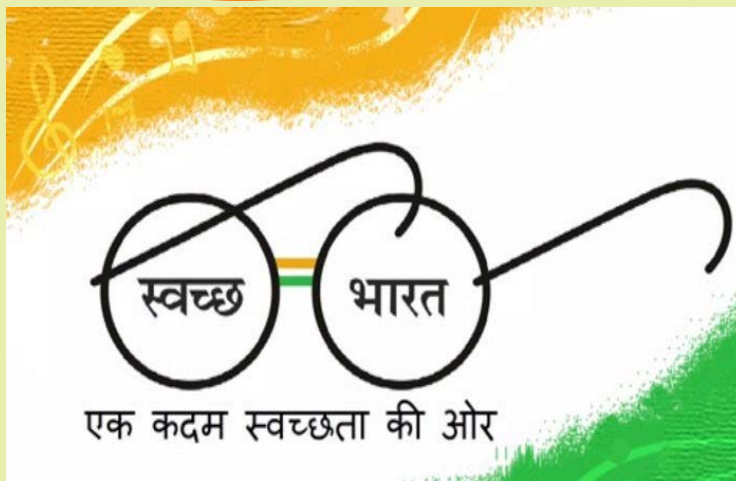

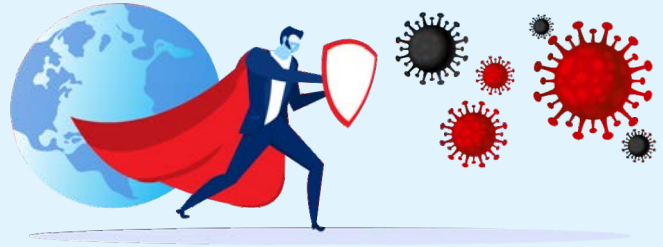

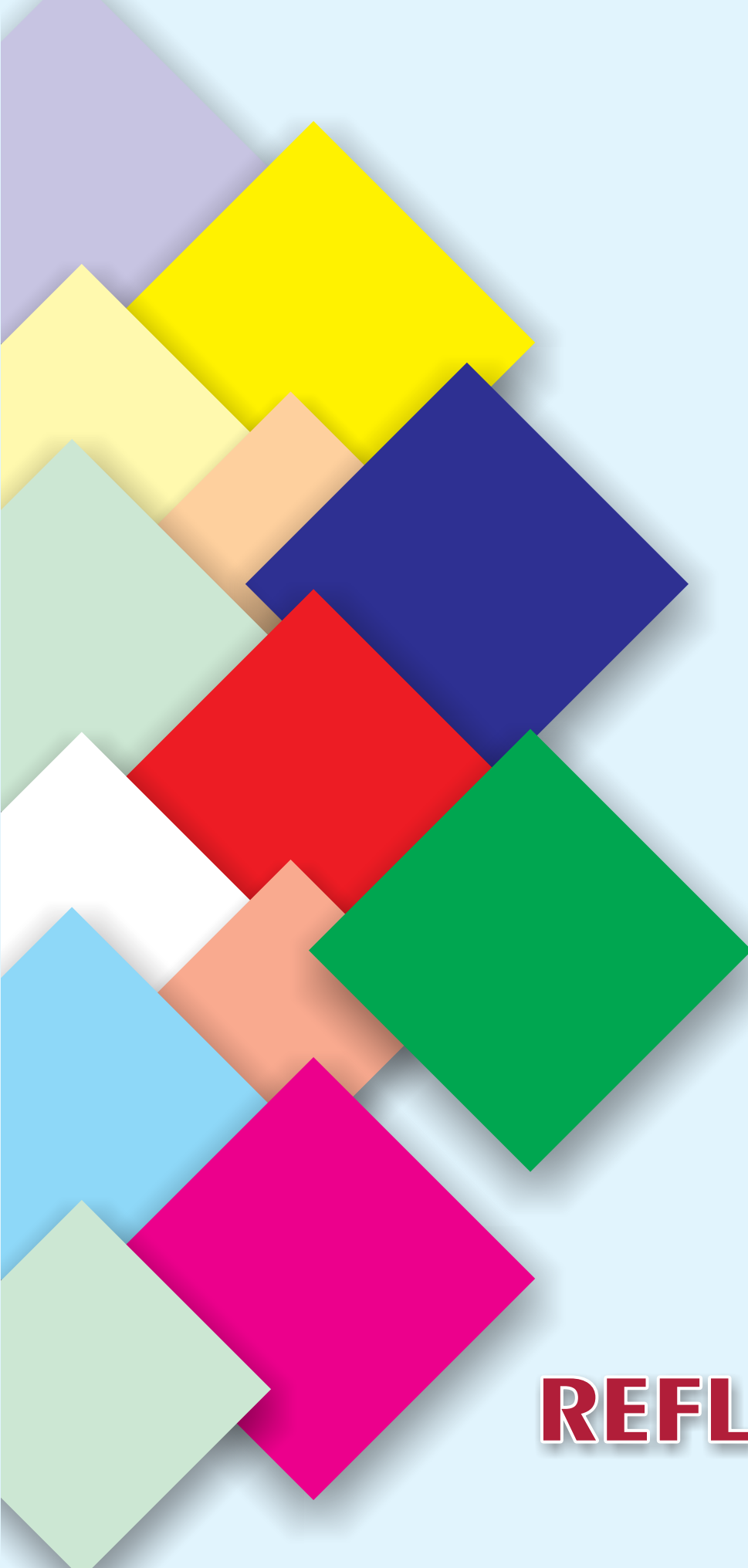

It is a matter of great honour and pride for me to present the Annual Report 2018 this evening.

At Rashtriya Military School Bengaluru, we have always been committed to create a conducive environment which helps the young minds blossom. We strive to provide the cadets a platform for holistic development of their personality. We set standards and goals for ourselves and work hard to achieve them – be it in the area of academics, sports, discipline, leadership and more.

It gives me immense pleasure and satisfaction to report that RMS Bengaluru, in keeping up with its traditions, has moved from strength to strength. This is reflected in the achievements of the school during the past one year.

At the very outset I would like to mention that the school has maintained its position in the list of the Best Indian schools. In the latest rankings released by the 'Education Today Magazine', RMS Bengaluru is ranked 8th in India, 2nd in Karnataka and 2nd in Bengaluru under the Best Boys Boarding School.

Education World Magazine has ranked RMS Bengaluru at 9th position under India's best boys boarding Schools and 2nd in Karnataka's Boys Boarding Schools.

In yet another survey conducted by Career 360^o Magazine, RMS Bengaluru is awarded '4A' rating which equals to 80-89 percentile and is termed as one of the Best schools in the country.

2. ACADEMICS

Academic achievements demonstrate an ability to perform to the best of one's potential by developing one's intellectual skills with diligence. Achieving academic excellence is at the core of our duty as educators. We are happy to share the details of the commendable performance of Classes X and XII.

Class X: 71 Cadets appeared for the CBSE Board examination. 9 cadets scored cent percent marks, 5 in Mathematics, 3 in Social Science and 1 in Hindi. 24 cadets have scored more than 90% marks and 30 have scored between 75 and 90% marks. Cadet Raja Babu scaled the pinnacle of glory by scoring 97%. In recognition of this performance, RMS Bengaluru was awarded the "Chief of Naval Staff Trophy" among the five Military Schools.

Class XII: Out of the 46 cadets who appeared for the CBSE Board exam, 21 passed with distinction and 23 scored first

divisions. 3 cadets secured more than 90% marks. Cadet Pranjal Singh topped the school by scoring 93.2%.

Govt of Karnataka has awarded a scholarship of Rs.15000 to one cadet and Rs.7000 to four cadets of the school for their meritorious academic performance.

3. NDA ENTRY

The school has always been dedicated towards the preparation of the cadets so as enable them to join the National Defence Academy.

16 out of 46 had cleared the UPSC examination. 5 among them cleared the SSB and finally 3 joined the 140th course. 3 more have made it to the 141st course and 1 has joined through the TES entry scheme. 3 cadets from the earlier batches have cleared their SSB.

I am proud to announce that 25 cadets out of 46 have cleared the UPSC examination for NDA this year. This is the best performance among the five military schools. I wish them all the best for their SSB.

4. Co-Curricular Activities

In the Interschool Bhatia Memorial Shield English Debate Competition organized by the Old Boy's Association, our school has lifted the overall championship trophy by competing with 24 participants from 12 reputed schools across Bengaluru. Cadet Dheeraj bagged the first position.

In the Interschool Verbattle Debate Contest 2018, in the senior section, cadet Preet Kundu and cadet Nitin Sharma cleared the Zonal Round and did exceedingly well at the Combat Level.

Cadet Aditya Arya of Class XI secured the first place in War of Words Competition organized by Presidency School, Bengaluru. He is awarded with the Presidency Challenge Cup Rolling Trophy, a laptop, a memento and a certificate. In the same event, cadet Saurabh was placed second in English Poetry Writing Competition.

The school's junior quiz team comprising of cadet Anmol and cadet Kumar Abhishek of class IX secured Runners up Trophy in the Space Quiz conducted by ISRO.

The school's senior quiz team comprising of cadet Vishal Dubey and cadet Vivek Kumar, qualified as one of the top South Zone teams in the News Wiz Quiz conducted by Mr Rajdeep Sardesai of India Today and subsequently participated in the national quiz in New Delhi. They also secured 3rd position in the Interschool quiz competition conducted by Nexus Quiz, Bengaluru.

The Innovation in Science Pursuit for Inspired Research (INSPIRE) programme has selected two projects with innovative ideas from class VI and class VIII of our school for the upcoming district level project presentation. These projects have been awarded a scholarship of Rs.10000 each by the Govt of Karnataka.

Cadet David Rane of class XI secured first position in the Photography competition conducted by the Bengaluru Medical College.

10 cadets of the Philately club have qualified in the first stage

of Deen Dayal Sparsh Yojana conducted by India Post.

In addition to this, the school regularly conducts many other activities like debate, elocution, essay writing, story writing, quiz, cultural show, national and religious functions.

5. Sports & Games

Games and Sports is an integral part of our curriculum. The cadets of the school actively participated in several competitions and won accolades for the school.

RMS Bengaluru won the Championship Trophy of the Interschool Basketball Tournament organized by Army Public School Kamaraj Road.

The school Basketball team bagged the championship trophy and a cash prize of Rs.5000 in the Interschool Bhatia Shield Basketball Tournament organised by the OBA.

Cadet Arpit of class X has qualified to participate in the National Boxing Championship to be held at Chandigarh from 12th Dec.
