LT GEN RAKESH KAPOOR, AVSM, VSM, DCOAS VISITS SCHOOL

Lt Gen Rakesh Kapoor, AVSM, VSM, Deputy Chief of Army Staff (IS&C) visited the School on 27 Feb 24. The General Officer was briefed by the Principal on various academic, administrative and manpower issues the School faces. He then went around the School campus, visiting the motivational hall, the digital lab, the resource room, the dormitories, the girl cadets' dorm and other places to get a first-hand observation of the infrastructure and the training imparted. Later, in his address to the staff at a special





assembly convened in his honour, the General Officer opined that the School could be justly proud of its alumni and the present generation of cadets could also be moulded to emulate their illustrious seniors. There should exist between the teachers and the students a strong and meaningful relationship; teachers should know their students' strengths and weaknesses; they should encourage cadets to inculcate in them the best practices – conduct and behavior and a thirst for knowledge. Joining the NDA should be the main aim of cadets but getting through other professional exams should also be an aim; building character and a

well-rounded personality should also be an aim. Reminding the academic staff how a liking for the teacher becomes a liking for the subject, he urged on them to make themselves likeable through their work and commitment. This school is fortunate to be located in Bengaluru which has great educational opportunities and opportunities for professional growth. Leverage this advantage: let the cadets prepare themselves for other competitive exams too. Personality is developed progressively. Personality development must start right from Cl VI, nothing much will happen in Cl XI & XII. More girl cadets will join, it should be the endeavour of the School to adapt themselves to the environment;





lady teachers esp should be able to play a major role in this regard. The Gen Officer concluded his address expressing his hope that in the next two years RMS Bengaluru becomes the No.1 school in Karnataka. LBA MEET


